TIPS FOR PEDESTRIANS, CYCLISTS AND DRIVERS **OF NON-MOTOR VEHICLES**









To ensure your safety and that of others, keep these rules in mind:

TO KEEP IN MIND

If you are a pedestrian, it is crucial to respect these rules when walking near tram tracks:

- The tram has priority. Always. Even at pedestrian crossings without traffic lights, the tram has the right of way.
- Use designated crossings and walkways. Do not walk along the tracks. Always use the marked areas and look both ways before crossing.
- Pay attention to signals. The tram emits a sound, similar to a bell, when approaching stops and crossings. Avoid distractions such as mobile phones or headphones so you can hear this signal.
- Wait safely. At tram stops, remain within the marked waiting areas and be especially cautious.



If you are a cyclist or drive a non-motor vehicle, it is crucial to follow these rules when traveling near tram tracks:

- **Do not block the tramway.** Never obstruct the tram's path. Do not stop, park, or ride on its platform. Only emergency vehicles may use it when necessary.
- Crossings and turns. If you need to cross the tramway, do so carefully and pay close attention to traffic lights and road signs.

- **Entries and exits.** When entering or leaving a garage, or joining a street near the tram tracks, stay alert and drive only through permitted areas.
- Be careful when crossing. Always look both ways before crossing the tracks, just as you would on any street. Be careful not to get your wheels caught in the rail to avoid accidents.
- The tramway is not a bike lane. The tram platform is not designed for non-motor vehicles. Use the specific lanes or paths for your type of vehicle.



Tram warning

Indicates the proximity of a tram crossing Remember: the tram ALWAYS has priority.
